4. Special Presentations (7:05-7:38)

a. **School Budget Presentation** by Superintendent Mummenthey and Assistant Superintendent Leon

- 500 community survey responses this year
- The proposed budget is \$107.8 million
- Bus propositions asks for \$1.5 million to cover the cost of nine new buses
- The tax levy of 2.34%, is once again below the tax cap
- Board of Education vote: three well-qualified candidates are running to fill two open seats.
- All current student programs & services are being maintained
- 30 new positions will be added in the areas of Instruction, Support, and Maintenance
- Foundation Aid has been returned to school for the first time in 22 years, which has helped with new investments that include:

- UPK, in connection with JCC
- 12.2 positions at the middle school level
- In-district Special Education, including a new Communications Class at Iroquois
- Additional full time school psychologist
- Elementary content-specials at each building, paid by a stipend
- IT/software/more help-desk staffing
- Field trips and assemblies re-instituted
- The budget is ²/₃ covered by local property tax and ¹/₃ covered by State Aid
- Many other specifics were shared that had previously been addressed in the budget hearings held at BofEd meetings, in mailings, and online.
- Of much interest to those attending this meeting was the mandate for all electric buses by 2035. The buses on the proposition this year weren't to be electric. It was explained that it is early in the development of the electric bus technology, so they are waiting to see how the early versions work out in neighboring districts.
- Other bus questions:
 - would it be possible to have smaller buses for smaller teams, since the driver shortage is an issue that has impacted sports teams.
 - Is the district looking at ways to extend the bus driver pool? There was a driver open house in June 2022; there will be training in July 2023 as well.

b. **Presentation on the Stadium Entryway Project** by Zak Cassady-Dorion & Pete Micieli

- Coaches/alumni/supporters have gathered and formed a group to look into creating an entryway for the new track and fields.
- They formed in connection with Niskayuna Youth Football, as they needed a 501C-3 tax-deductible group that was already in existence. This does not preclude other groups from benefiting, obviously, as it is a great community plan.
- They have hired an engineer & architect who have created a plan for construction.
- There will be a ticketbooth and storage on top of a cement pad that was laid out in the plan. This includes the needed electricals and future water lines; the actual building is what is missing.
- A Committee was formed that created a GoFund Me campaign, has contacted 150 local businesses, and had a fundraiser night at The Broken Inn.
- Bricks will also be sold as a fundraiser as well.
- Superintendent Mummenthey has sent a Letter of Intent to the NYSED about this future project.
- Forms and information are available locally, on social media, and will also be shared on the Niskayuna Athletics Booster Club website.
- The Niskayuna Athletics Booster Club has pledged \$2500 toward this project.
- If the group has raised \$200K by the end of July, they could begin construction.
